For Blind Gets

World Book Set

The Nebraska State Library for the Blind at the Library for the Blind in the State Capitol was presented the first volumes of the Braille World Book Encyclopedia Tuesday.

The encyclopedia is the largest single undertaking in the history of Braille. Clarence V. Hadenfeldt of Omaha made the presentation.

A display of Braille material and volumes of the new Braille set of World books was supervised by Mrs. Greta Koehler of 1837 Washington.

The encyclopedia comprises 145 volumes, 38,000 pages, and spreads over 43 feet of shelf space. Full price, representing only manufacturing costs, is \$616.25

The men and women of Hadenfeldt's Tall Corn Division contributed the money for the set which was donated to the Nebraska State Library for the Blind.

Hadenfeldt said shipments are also on their way to institutions for the blind in other U.S. cities as well as Canada, Latin America and Europe.
