To Nebraska libraries:-

We have in contemplation the publication of a bulletin, similar to that published by the Wisconsin library commission—copies of which we are sending you, together with Prentice's valuable pamphlet, "A children's library". Please examine this Wisconsin bulletin carefully. If we undertake to publish such a bulletin, we shall depend on you to keep us informed, not only concerning your own library, but as to all other items of interest to Nebraska libraries that may come within your notice. Are you willing to co-operate? Our decision as to publishing a bulletin rests largely upon what we hear from you. If we undertake the work, we shall have a department for public libraries, one for school libraries, and one for traveling libraries. Such a publication would surely help to advance library interests in the state.

In order to keep our mailing list up to date, you are requested to fill out the enclosed statistical blank, and mail it to us at your early convenience.

We call your attention to Library day, and send you our circular concerning its observance in the schools. Can you not co-operate with your school in making Library day a success? The Lewis and Clark literature in your library should be of great help to the schools. If your supply of such literature is limited, there is no time like the present to add books on that subject. Can you not have Library day observances at the library?
