Eligibility of blind and other disabled persons for loan of library materials: 1. Those people whose visual acuity, as determined by competent authority, is 20/200 or less in the better eye with correcting lenses, or whose widest diameter of visual field subtends an angular distance no greater than 20 degrees. 2. Those with physical disabilities are eligible as follows: (a) Persons whose visual impairment, with correction and regardless of optical measurement, is certified by competent authority as preventing the reading of regular printed material. (b) Persons certified

by competent authority as unable to read or unable to use regular printed material because of physical limitations. (c) Persons certified by competent authority as having a reading disability resulting from organic dysfunction and of sufficient severity to prevent reading regular printed material in a conventional manner.
