

JUST WRITE A POSTAL CARD



If your public library is open regularly ask  
your librarian to write for books not available  
locally.

If you live where there is no library write  
yourself. Any book may be borrowed by indi-  
viduals for one month. Adults may borrow  
for children in the household.

Books are sent by mail. You pay only the  
postage, usually from 4c to 6c for a book.  
Remit in stamps after receiving the book  
ordered.

Community groups, public libraries and  
rural schools may get boxes of books and sup-  
plementary loans. These are called "traveling  
libraries" and are loaned for three months.
